




## The Fifth Floor: Ideas Taking Space

It then takes The Fifth Floor exhibition at Tate Liverpool as a case study to examine how artistic approaches accommodate (or undermine) this curatorial practice through numerous interviews and texts by participating artists. Finally, it explores how radical curatorial strategies and approaches to exhibition making crossover into the unchartered territory between art, education and audience development.
